MINUTES OF THE 2nd MEETING OF THE SENATE POST GRADUATE COMMITTEE (SPGC) HELD ON 12th of October, 2015 AT 03.30 P.M. IN THE BOARD ROOM, IIITA ALLAHABAD.

The 2nd meeting of the Senate Post Graduate Committee was held on **12th of October, 2015** at 03.30 P.M in the Board Room, IIIT Allahabad. The following **members were present:-**

The Chairman, Senate Post Graduate Committee (SPGC) welcomed the members. Agenda items were then taken up for consideration.

Item No.1 To receive and confirm the minutes of the 1st SPGC meeting held on 07/08/2015 as circulated on 23/09/2015.

The minutes of the 1st SPGC meeting held on 07/08/2015 as circulated on 23/09/2015 were confirmed

Item No.2 Reporting of Items i.e. extension of PhD duration approvals given by the Chairman, Senate/SPGC

The SPGC ratified the following decisions taken /approval given by Chairman, Senate/ SPGC:

- Extension of 01 year to Ms. Shivangi Raman(RS-72) till 30th August,2016
- Extension of 06 months to Mr. Aditya Kishore Saxena till 1st March,2016
- Extension of 06 months to Mrs. Jyoti Srivastava till 10th March,2016
- Extension of 06 months to Mr. Shaishav Agarwal till 15th March,2016
- Extension of 06 months to Mr. Sayantan Nath till 8th January,2016



Item No.3 Reporting of the Change of Supervisor as per the approval of Chairman-SPGC

The SPGC noted and accepted the following approvals for change of supervisor

- a) Mr. Gajendra Sharma (RS-118) new supervisor is Dr. Manish Kumar
- b) Ms. Jyoline Germaine D'sa (RS-155) new supervisor is Dr. Manish Goswami & Co-supervisor- Prof. B.R.Singh
- c) Mr. Divyesh Sachan (RS-168) new supervisor is Dr. Prasanna Misra & co-supervisor is Dr. Manish Goswami
- d) Mr. Roy Chaitanya Kumar R.P. (IWC2013006) will be guided by –Dr. Pavan Chakraborty, Dr. Shirshu Verma , Dr. S.Venkatesan & Dr. Jagpreet Singh to complete his M Tech dissertation.

Item No.4 Adopting of MHRD GO F.No.17-2/2014-T.S.-1 dated 1st September, 2015 regarding the Scholarship of PhD students & relook of programme length for various courses (as per the minutes of the 2nd senate meeting)

The SPGC recommends to Senate for adopting the MHRD GO F.No.17-2/2014-T.S.-1 dated 1st September, 2015 which states to have a uniform duration of 5 years for payment of fellowship to research scholars irrespective of their qualification. Committee however felt that the duration as decided by the 2nd Senate should not be changed.

Item No.5 Discussion about the observation & Advise for the pre-submission seminars as circulated to the faculty and research scholars vide email along with the changed formats for the same.

The observations and advice for the pre-submission seminar as circulated by SPGC chair to the research scholars was well taken by all. It was further agreed that the DPGC would suggest & formulate the board on request of the supervisor which would further be approved by SPGC chair and Chairman-Senate.

Item No.6 Approval of the formats for various PG processes and the thesis submission instructions (taken up from previous SPGC meeting)

In principle the formats were approved for further uploading on the website, however if some minor corrections come up from time to time then it would be incorporated after approval of SPGC-Chair.

Item No. 7 Case of Ms. Swechcha Misra (RS-148)

The committee advised that the candidate should be given time till the end of this semester to come and join the course .An email thereafter be send to the candidate intimating that the process of termination would be initiated.

Item No. 8 To discuss the constitution of the Open Seminar and final viva-voce panels for PhD student along with who would chair the committee.

Open seminar panel would be as follows:

- DPGC nominee (to be the chairman of the board)
- Supervisor Nominee
- External department Expert (to be proposed by the supervisor).
- Supervisor & co-supervisor (will be passive members and make arrangement for noting down all the comments and suggestions of the board, a compiled copy of the same would be submitted to the SPGC office for records and finalization of the open seminar report)

Note: Decision regarding the open seminar i.e satisfactory/unsatisfactory should be taken immediately by the panel and duly signed by all the experts.

Final PhD Thesis Viva-Voce Panel would consist of the following:

- Supervisor
- DPGC nominee
- Supervisor Nominee
- External Expert (nominated by the chairman-Senate)



Item No.9 To discuss the clause of SCI journal and Tier-1 & Tier-2 publication as approved in the 19th & 21st RDC meetings

The committee felt that the 2SCI clause has improved the research level and therefore recommends its continuation. For research scholars admitted prior to 2012, this clause is implemented at the time of viva-voce. It was decided to impress on the supervisors to try and enforce the rule. However, if these students are not able to fulfill the 02 SCI criteria, the supervisor on his discretion may request the SPGC for relaxation based upon the following:

- Very good report from the thesis referees.
- Student having SCOPUS index paper where 02 SCOPUS index papers would be considered equivalent to 01 SCI
- Good conference paper

Though some of the SCOPUS index papers are very good, still the committee still felt not to consider inclusion of 04 SCOPUS papers as equivalent to 02 SCI.

Members were of the view that if a conference is getting papers peer reviewed and published in reputed journal proceedings then it can be considered in Tier-1 & Tier-2 conference list.

Item No. 10 Proposal to create a PhD Thesis Repository

All the members agreed that it was a good initiative and the procedure to create a repository is taken up in a phased manner. A team should be identified to work on the repository using DSpace. The thesis should first be put on the intranet.

Item No.11 Case of Ms. Pinki Kumari (Project sponsored candidate) - The thesis topic does not match with the problem definition of the projects in which she has worked.

The committee was of the opinion that a reminder is send to the supervisor again and the open-seminar report be compiled only after receiving the reply from the supervisor.

Item No.12 Request of Bhupesh Kumar (RS-65) under the supervision of Prof. Anupam Agarwal for granting of study break.

The case of Mr. Bhupesh Kumar was taken up and it was decided that since under the rules no break is allowed therefore his request for break of one year cannot be allowed. However, in order to complete the work and submit the thesis an extension of 01 year can be given (06 months at a time). After 01 year of extension the research scholar needs to reregister in the course, his current candidature would stand cancelled.

Item No.13 Development of a PhD admission brochure of each department (as circulated to all the DPGC & Head through email dated 10th September, 2015; Discussion of PhD admission process; Dates for advertisement; Department's keenness to take students in the even semester.

The committee members felt that the PhD admission brochure should be developed with a common format. The SPGC would propose a common draft for all the departments to provide the matter related to their departments so that the brochure can be finalized. Each department will identify volunteers who will do the job in consultation with the chairman SPGC.

Item No.14 Reporting of Thesis viva-voce completed and eligible for award of degree in the convocation

The SPGC recommends to Senate for consideration and award of the degree to the successful candidates in the upcoming convocation. It was decided that Ms. Saloni who is defending her PhD thesis defense on 14th October, 2015 also be included in the list provided she clears the viva-voce and is recommended for award of PhD Degree by the evaluation committee. SPGC also noticed that 14 PhD degrees will be awarded taking the total number of institute PhD from 28 to 42.



Item No.15 To discuss the renaming of M Tech/PhD Degrees awarded by the institute & also the duration of PhD degree (Inclusion of PhD degree in the department of Electronics & engineering) (Reference minutes of the 3rd meeting of Academic Council.)

The SPGC members were of the opinion that the degrees should be simple and in 3rd person, so that it remains independent of gender (he/she). IIT Bombay format was provided for consideration. The committee authorized the chairman-SPGC to expedite the matter and go ahead taking the final permission from the chairman-senate. It was decided not to mention “in Information technology” in the PhD degree. The title of the thesis will be mentioned only in English. The English title in Hindi/devnagari script is removed. However for further streamlining the formats a sub-committee be constituted as follows:

- Dr. Pavan Chakraborty
- Dr. Neetish Purohit
- Dr. Vijay Chaurasiya

Item No.16. Any other point to be taken up (if suggested) after the discussion of agenda points in the DPGC meeting of the departments.

The departments put up their DPGC minutes for consideration in the meeting. Some important points to be noted for consideration are as follows:

1. Implementation of any set of rules related to Post-graduate studies after their modification should not be applied retrospectively.
2. The change of name of the existing course “M.Tech in IT (specialization in Bioinformatics)” both for dual degree and direct admission to be renamed as **M Tech in Bioinformatics** and put under the Applied Science department.
3. Proposition for colour coding for PhD and M Tech thesis as Rust Red and Black respectively.
4. Nomination of a nodal officer to initiate the Vishweshwarya PhD Scheme. Chairman SPGC be nominated for the purpose since it is Ph.D. related matter.
5. PG handbook to be developed in detail so that it is given to the student at the time of admission.
6. Proposal to set up a doctoral committee in each department from 2015 batch onwards.
7. Syllabus of the comprehensive exam would be developed by the DPGC or a committee formed by the DPGC chair and further sends to SPGC for ratification.
8. In the reported plagiarism cases of Mr. Nitish Ojha & Ms. Nidhi Kushwaha it was decided that a written explanation be asked from the supervisor and the student which would further be forwarded to DPGC for necessary decision.
9. Merging M. Tech (WCC) and M.Tech(CE) into M.Tech(WCE) has been proved inappropriate . Thus in 2016, the institute should discontinue M .Tech (WCE) and again resume both original courses M.Tech (IT) with specialization in WCC and M.Tech (ECE) with specialization in Communication Engineering.
10. The point No.4 and obligations of JRF/SRF (Point No.6.II) as per the G.O F.No. 17-2/2014-T.S.-1 of MHRD was well taken and accepted by all the committee members.
11. Posters should be prepared and circulated to attract good PhD students.
12. Renaming of the course name SSKDE to Data Mining and Warehousing (DMW) was approved.
13. As apprised by DPGC representative –Management department that the B Tech MBA & MBA-PhD course structure were reviewed and approved in the senate in 2014 .Therefore it would be followed likewise.
14. Qualification of mandatory NET to be introduced for admission to students in PhD –Management
15. The fee structure of integrated program (MBA-PhD & M Tech-PhD) to be reviewed with a request to the finance committee so that uniformity can be maintained across courses.



16. The case of Mr. Vinod Jatav (RS-142) was discussed and as per the SPGC decision the recommendation of the committee would stand.
17. The committee agreed to the proposal raised to give hospitality and TA to the external guide only for Viva-voce of the research scholar.

Besides the above points, the committee in principle approved the minutes of the DPGC as discussed by the departmental DPGC conveners. (As attached)

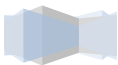

Year 2015: Minutes of the 2nd Meeting of the DPGC of the ECE Department

(Venue: Room no. 2106, CC-1 Date: 1st Oct'2015

Time: 04:00PM)

The following resolution have been made after thorough deliberation:

1. The course of M.Tech.(EC) with specialization in Communication Engineering (CE) was started in July 2012 while the course of M.Tech.(IT) with specialization in Wireless Communication and Computing (WCC) was started in July 2002. In July 2014, the Senate decided to discontinue these two courses, and start a new course as M.Tech. with specialization in Wireless Communication Engineering (WCE) as an Inter departmental Program (IDP).

In last two years, it is found that the motive of this merging/opening is not being fulfilled. Hence, it is decided to close the M.Tech.(IDP)-WCE, and to restart the above two M.Tech. program. The curriculum of M.Tech.(EC)-CE and the seat matrix is attached herewith as Annexure-1 and Annexure-2 respectively. This should be placed before the Senate for its ratification.

2. Thesis Repository in case of PhD may be compulsory on Intranet, however, in case of Internet, it may be the choice of the Thesis Supervisor. While, in case of M.Tech. Thesis, the repository may be compulsory, but only on Intranet.
3. The matter of Mr. Nitin Goel (RS-111), PhD Student of ECE department, was discussed in the light of the comments received from his supervisors Prof. B. R. Singh and Dr. Neetesh Purohit. Both of them are of the opinion that the student may not be able to complete the requirement of PhD program. It should be communicated to the concerned student.

Apart from the above following two other agenda items were proposed by DPGC Convener for the discussion under DPGC and may be put before the Senate subsequently, if decided:

1. Scheduling of GD/PI for MBA Admissions (2016 Batch) in the last week of January
2. Changes in the course credit for the subjects MPOE & MPOM offered in Engineering courses.

Minutes of the Meeting for Senate:

1. IIIT-A is listed in CAT- 2015 as Non-IIM Member Institution. . The result for the CAT 2015 is expected in the second week of January 2016. Early GD/PI may be perceived positively by the applicants in sense that reputed institution are following the similar trends. Therefore, the DPGC deliberated in length (**Agenda Item No. 1**) on the suggestion of scheduling GD/PI for MBA admissions (Batch 2016) in January 2016. Finally, the committee agreed over the agenda item and decided to come up with admission notification (Batch 2016) as early as possible so that GD/PI may be arranged after the declaration of CAT 2015 results till mid of February 2016. The committee felt that this decision may lead to get better student both quantitatively and qualitatively. The original agenda is attached herewith (**Annexure No. 1**).

In due course of discussion on the agenda item 1 following concerns were raised by different members:

- a. Review of eligibility criteria for MBA admissions- 2016.
 - i. From current to allowing graduates from all disciplines, on concern that two barriers namely CAT and B. Tech. will seriously limit the number of interested and eligible students.

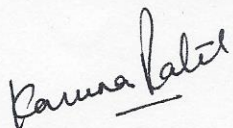
c. The chair was of the opinion that a separate meeting of DPGC may be called to take up these issues.

2. The meeting ended with vote of thanks by DPGC Convener.



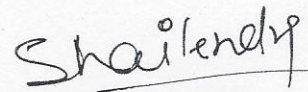

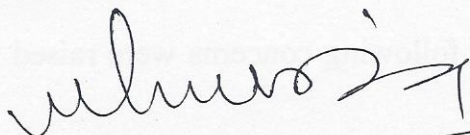

4. Later on in April, we may also go with second round of GD/PI, if needed at all, which is at par with our current practice.

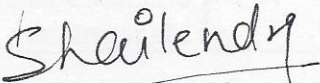


Agenda Item B: Change in the course credit for the subjects MPOE and MPOM

**1st DPGC Meeting of Department of Information Technology,
Indian Institute of Information Technology, Allahabad
(9th Oct 2015, 3:30PM)**

A DPGC Meeting has been called by Convener on 9th Oct 2015 at 3:30 PM to discuss and resolve the agenda items received from all the faculty members and PG students of IT department. Prior to this meeting the agenda items were invited by convener, DPGC via email on 20th Sep 2015. The meeting has been attended by Dr. Vijay Chaurasia (Convener), Dr. Shekhar Verma (HoD (IT)), Dr. S. Venkatesan, Dr. Satish K Singh, Dr. Jagpreet Singh, Mr. Manish Kumar and Mr. Nitish Andola. The minutes of the meeting are as follows

Agenda Item-1: Proposition for colour coding and uniform format for final M. Tech and Ph.D. thesis for the department of IT. (Rust Red for Ph.D. and Black for M.Tech.).

Resolution: The Proposition has been accepted. The PhD and M.Tech thesis of IT department will be of Rust-Red and Black Colour respectively. The proposed colour format shall be circulated by SPGC to all PG students of the department.

Agenda Item-2: Discussions on possibilities for encouragement for pursuing higher degrees as per F.NO.17-2/2014-TS.I Government of India Ministry of Human Resource Development Department of Higher Education, Dated 18th Feb 2015.

Resolution: The discussion was done as per the section 5 of above mentioned GO. The Chair, informed that this is already functional.

Agenda Item-3: Initiating and appointment of Nodal officer for Vishweshwraya Ph.D. scheme, by Institute.

Resolution: The DPGC is of strong opinion that a Nodal Officer at Institute level must be nominated from institute side as soon as possible. The DPGC recommends the name of SPGC chair as the nodal officer to initiate the Vishweshwraya Ph.D. scheme.

Agenda Item-4: Ensuring the enforcement of PG Manual.

Resolution: The DPGC is of strong opinion that the approved PG manual must be enforced appropriately. This must be ensured by the SPGC.

Agenda Item-5: Devising the scheme for departmental TA Allotment.

Resolution: As per the opinion of Chair and Other members of DPGC this is an administrative issue and not related to DPGC.

Agenda Item-6: PG Handbook must be developed by the SPGC and to be given to the students as soon as student gets registered with the institute. All the necessary information including PG manual, Processes, Forms, Formats and Fee etc.



Resolution: The DPGC is of strong opinion that a PG Handbook must be developed by the SPGC and to be given to the students as soon as student gets registered with the institute. The handbook shall contain all necessary information including the PG manual, Processes, Forms, Formats and Fee etc. It is necessary because the students registered with the institute shall have all information about the rules, regulations, processes, forms, formats and fees etc., which are applicable to them. The amendments as approved by senate or appropriate approving body/authority must be included in this PG handbook for every batch of students and the same will be applicable to them throughout their stay in the Institute.

Agenda Item-7: Discussions on possibilities for the split site PhD programs supported by MHRD and other agencies of GOI.

Resolution: A draft to be prepared by Dr. Satish Kumar Singh (Already working as local coordinator, GIAN programme by MHRD, GOI) for initiating the split site PhD program, as soon as possible. The DPGC has strong opinion to form a International Relation (IR) Cell consisting of faculty members and students for exploring the possibilities of international collaboration in academic and research and exchange programs at department level.

Agenda Item-8: Discussion on possibility and modality for formation of DPMC's for various PhD registered students.

Resolution: Since this is not yet approved by senate, so deferred till its approval by senate.

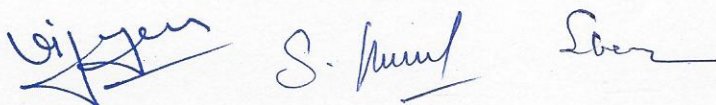
Agenda Item-9: Syllabus for the comprehensive examination to be discussed and finalized: The syllabus of the comprehensive examination for the departments would be developed separately by DPGC or through a committee formed by the DPGC chair and further send to SPGC and senate for ratification."

Resolution: The DPGC resolved to have two components for comprehensive examination for prospective PhD students namely (a) Breath & (b) Depth examinations.

Under the breath examination, it is suggested to have two compulsory courses namely (i) Maths and (ii) C-Programming & Data Structure and few choice based IT/CSE related subjects. (e.g. Networking, Algorithms, Probability and Stats etc.). The students to be evaluated on the basis of written examination.

Under the depth examination, it is suggested to have the presentation followed by viva-voce form the subjects completed as course work by the prospective PhD student. The responsibility of the paper setting for (a) and formation of viva-voce board for (b) is with the HOD/Chairperson, DPGC. The syllabus for (a) to be finalized and circulated by DPGC in consultation with HoD (IT), among the students as soon as possible.

The comprehensive examinations shall be held in June and December. This year (2015) the Comprehensive exam supposed to be held in December-2015 and in February-2016.



Agenda Item-10: Decision in various plagiarism cases as reported by Ph.D. Cell.

Resolution: The SPGC is requested to seek for the written explanations from the students and supervisor(s) on the issues reported. The same may be forwarded to DPGC for further discussions and necessary decision.

Agenda Item-11: Merging M. Tech. (WCC) and M. Tech. (CE) into M. Tech. (WCE) has been proved inappropriate. Thus, from the session 2016, the institute should discontinue M. Tech. (WCE) and again resume both original courses viz. M. Tech. (ECE) with specialization in Communication Engineering and M. Tech. (IT) with specialization in WCC. DPGC (ECE) and DPGC (IT).

Resolution: DPGC agreed in principle and same may be forwarded to Senate through SPGC for further approval.

Agenda Item-12: Any other agenda item with the permission of chair and convener.

Other Agenda Item-1: Discussions on publication/patent (Point No.4) and obligations of JRF/SRF (Point No.6.II) as per F.NO.17-2/2014-TS.I Government of India Ministry of Human Resource Development Department of Higher Education, Dated 18th Feb 2015.

Resolution: The discussion was done against the point number-4 & 6.II of above mentioned GO. The DPGC resolved against the points as follows,

(a) The results of JRF/SRF/M.E./M.Tech/MS/M.Design research work published in any journals must have appropriate acknowledgement for funding agency of Government of India (e.g. MHRD, GOI).

(b) The JRF/SRF/M.E./M.Tech/MS/M.Design must send a detailed consolidated report of the research work done during the entire period of fellowship on completion of the tenure/registration of the fellowship at earliest. The hard and soft copy of the report/thesis must be kept in the institute repository (library) with proper identification (indexing) and a list of such JRF/SRF /M.E. /M.Tech /MS/ M.Design, containing the Name, En./Reg. No., Title of Research Work (Thesis title), Duration of fellowship, and submission date must be prepared and displayed on Institute website appropriately. The submission in Institute repository must be ensured by DPGC (at department level) and may be ensured by SPGC (at Institute level).

Other Agenda Item-2: Preparation and circulation of poster for IT department for PhD admissions to attract good PhD students.

Resolution: The DPGC resolved to prepare the PhD admission related posters of IT department. This poster, contain the thrust areas, to be published from departmental fund and to be circulated in hard and soft forms to various good target institutes. Dr. Jagpreet Singh and Dr. S. Venkatesan have been requested to prepare the poster and address list of target institutions for circulation, in consultation with DPGC & HoD.



Other Agenda Item-3: Request for renaming of course "Software System for Knowledge data Engineering (SSKDE)" from Dr. Manish Kumar.

Resolution: As per the recommendation of concerned faculty associated in teaching the courses namely, SSKDE, which is running in M.Tech (IT), SE and WCE and Data Mining & Warehousing (DMW), which also running in IT department, have the identical course contents so the name of SSKDE to be changed to Data Mining and Warehousing. The DPGC approves the same. The new course name for SSKDE shall be renamed as Data Mining & Warehousing (DMW) from July, 2016.

Other Agenda Item-4: Proposal for introducing the electives in the department of IT.


Resolution: The DPGC received two proposals for introducing the electives namely, (i) Machine Learning and (ii) Design pattern. The first course is proposed by Dr. Shekhar Verma, Dr. Manish Kumar and Dr. K. P. Singh, whereas the second by Dr. Amrita Chaturvedi. The DPGC approved the proposal on machine learning. The DPGC could not find any details along with the proposal for Design Pattern, hence did not approve the same. The proposer is advised to send the detail proposal including the introduction, objectives, prerequisite, target class of students, detailed syllabus, outcome, text-books, reference-books, other references, laboratory and other requirements. The revised proposal may be considered in the next DPGC meeting.


Other Agenda Item-5: Time-lag between submission of thesis and final defence of PhD students.

Resolution: The DPGC has strong opinion that the time-lag between draft thesis submission and final viva-voce should not exceed 4 months. The SPGC must device the mechanism and take appropriate measures for the same to avoid unnecessary delay.

Other Agenda Item-6: Call for Electives.

Resolution: The DPGC feels that more electives to be introduced in various baskets of electives of IT department, hence all the faculty members from IT department are requested to send the dully completed proposals for introducing new electives to Dr. Vijay Chaurasiya, convener DPGC.
