Minutes of 7th meeting of the SUGC

The 7th meeting of SUGC was held on 20/06/2016 in the Exam Cell at 11:30AM. The following members were present:

The issues discussed and the recommendations made were as follows:

1. Regarding modifications to existing Undergraduate courses

The SUGC met to place its recommendation over the proposed changes in Undergraduate courses as submitted to Senate as Agenda Item #27. After extensive discussions, the following recommendations were made:

- a. The elective in Bioinformatics to be floated in B.Tech. (IT) Sem-7 shall be a 3-credit course with no lab component.
- b. The SUGC agrees with the Departmental recommendation regarding course structure changes in the 7th and 8th semesters of of B.Tech (IT) shown below. These changes are proposed to be applicable for B.Tech (IT) batches starting from those who were admitted in 2013:



- c. No changes in B.Tech (ECE) are proposed except those listed in Agenda Item #10.
- d. No changes in Dual Degree courses are proposed in their first six semesters.

2. Regarding student appeals

- a. Mr. Irfan Irshad (IBM2014002) could not attend mandatory 50% of classes. He appealed **(Annx. 1)** for leniency considering his medical condition by approving a leave of 65 days. The SUGC concurs with the HoD's recommendations that:
- i. 65 days of leave is too long to approve
 - ii. The student appeared in the end semester exams provisionally. The student may be asked to repeat all the courses with short attendance.
 - iii. The student may not be allowed to register till declared medically fit by a psychiatrist nominated by CMO of the Institute.
- b. Mr. Varun Singh (RIT2014067) appealed **(Annx. 2)** for the leave which was approved by the HoD, thereby meeting 50% attendance requirement in EPOC432C. The SUGC thereby removed his name from the list of students with short attendance.
