Secretary and student observers did not attend the meeting. However, Mr. Omar Hassan attended to represent his case.

Resolution of SUGC regarding Mr. Omar Hassan

Mr. Omar Hassan (IIT2013010) was admitted into B.Tech (IT) programme in 2013. His request for semester leave was taken up by Senate during its 3rd meeting, held on 17/10/2015. The Senate had then resolved that, the "Institute CMO be requested to constitute a Medical Board and check the medical condition of the student in light of papers presented by him." And it further resolved that, "the same shall be considered by the SUGC then for any further decision in the matter" (Annex 1).

Based on the report given by the CMO in response to request for action (Annex 2), the SUGC made the following resolutions:

1. The CMO be requested again to submit the report on Institute's letter head and proper seal. The recommendations of Doctors panel should be clearly mentioned in report.
2. Assuming that the above request is accepted and is in favour of Mr. Omar, the following shall be the recommendations from SUGC:
 - a. SUGC recommends sanctioning of the concerned Semester Leave to the Senate.
 - b. Following the UG guidelines implemented since 3rd Senate, the SUGC recommends restoration of grades obtained by him in his first attempt in 2nd semester.
 - c. To declare the grades obtained in subjects registered in 3rd semester, including those subjects in which he appeared against advice of HoD (IT). The SUGC resolved that the advice was non-binding, unlike in the newer policy where explicit written approval is required for course registration.
